Nature

Most readers are aware of the emblem of the RSPB, the Avocet, that attractive, black and white wader with the upturned bill. The spread in its breeding area and in the location of wintering birds has been a great success since the war. In 1947 it re-established itself on the coast of Suffolk and has now spread to the north of England and South Wales. Although it favours brackish lagoons it has started to breed inland. Many birds move west in winter and are a popular attraction on the Exe and Tamar estuaries. The population is augmented by birds from the continent. However you do not have to take a boat trip from Plymouth to see them; because they may be observed downriver of St Germans at Wacker. Recently I noted over 80 there actively feeding. They move from the Tamar when feeding areas are covered by silt in heavy rains. Once I saw an individual bird interrupting its migration on a rockpool in Donderry, an odd occurrence which proves that you never know what may turn up. Alan Payne

Climate Emergency

Many of you may have read the latest news about climate change, and it makes depressing reading. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change said in the last few weeks that "Limiting global warming to 1.5 degrees centigrade will require rapid, far reaching and unprecedented changes in all aspects of society." Reading this may give a feeling of hopelessness, but together we *can* make a positive difference. We can make our own changes, talk to others and make a big noise at big companies, our politicians

and the businesses we use. Let's lead the way! Here are five actions to begin.

1. Switch to renewable energy providers and green your commute - walk or cycle if you can, use public transport or car share if you can't. We are lucky to have a train station in St Germans and buses through both parishes. Pick up timetables from St Germans Community Shop.

2. Buy local food and buy more local vegetables - especially if they're grown in a good way, without chemicals (all of which use fossil fuels). We are lucky to have several excellent village shops in our parishes. Support them and not only are you doing your bit, but also keeping your money in the local economy.

3. Don't throw any food away! We waste so much - give yourself the challenge to waste 'nothing'.

4. Get informed: start with www.friendsoftheearth.uk/climate-change

5. Join the many who are already writing to MPs in Cornwall - and they're replying!

And join the Climate Vision Pledge Group: climatevision.co.uk/top-ten-pledges

Then join the bigger movement! There is a climate change Extinction Rebellion group that meets at the Halfway House in Polbathic on Tuesdays at 7pm. They are a really friendly active group and new members are always welcome.

From the Parishes - St. Germans

Seasonal greetings from St.Germans Parish

At the December meeting, a member of the public asked the Parish to commit to being Carbon Neutral to help limit climate changes which were discussed at a global meeting in Katowice. The chairman highlighted things which the Parish has supported in respect to planning on renewables. It was agreed on a majority vote that individual councillors would investigate other possible options that could be adopted. Also at the meeting the new train timetable for January to May 2019 was distributed. A recommendation from the finance committee not to increase the 2018/2019 precept for 2019/2020 was unanimously passed. So for the coming financial year, the Parish will have a 0% increase over the current year precept.

News on the closure of Doctors Lane, it is thought that repairs will begin in early January and should be reopened soon after remedial work has been completed.

Some councillors are working to host public meeting in various location, with the view to identify issues that are problematic to the local communities. There is a lot of preparation needed before the Parish consults with the various wards, this is thought to be in April. With yet another bank closing in Saltash, the Parish has been asked if Nat West mobile banking could call at more rural villages, in particular St. Germans

There has been no further action with respect to the proposed new car park at St. Germans train station. Cornwall Council are awaiting a response from GWR before any planning application can be submitted.

Finally , Tideford play park has had repairs carried out which had been highlighted following the weekly inspections. More work is scheduled when weather permits and this may not be until the spring

News from Cornwall - Jesse Foot

"Happy New Year to one and all and here's to hoping for a brighter 2019. At the beginning of December 2018, the Local Government Boundary Commission for England announced their final recommendations regarding divisional boundaries for Cornwall Councillors starting in 2021. The number of councillors will be reduced from 123 to 87. St Germans and its parishes will be included in a new division called St Germans and Rame Peninsula. This effectively doubles the size of the electorate and increases the geographical area significantly. As a result, the role of your Cornwall Councillor will change to one of a more strategic nature. A large amount of work will be undertaken from a constitution and governance perspective to ensure the democratic side of the council runs as effectively as possible. Following on from the larger Cornwall Council divisional changes, there will also be a Community Governance review looking at current parish boundaries and if any changes are needed. Please get in touch if you are aware of any local changes that might help our parishes function better. Also announced in December was the disappointing news that there will not be a Cornish Tick box on the next census in 2021. One will still be able to identify as Cornish but will have to tick other and write Cornish or, using the online census return, there will be an electronic drop down option to identify as Cornish. There will be more news about this in the future. Finally, I am genuinely hoping for a brighter 2019 for one and all, but this will only happen if each one of us takes positive steps to follow the golden rule. My new year's resolution is not about losing weight, getting more exercise or spending less time looking at screens...though all of these would be good for me to do anyway. My resolution is to treat other people the way I'd like to be treated or do unto others as I would have others do unto me. From a practical point of view this means putting myself into other people's shoes, listening to and understanding their concerns, thinking about their needs, and helping to meet those needs. This is easier said than done as I am a naturally selfish person - ask my wife and daughters. And applying the Golden Rule to the ones with whom we are closest is often the biggest challenge, but that is where I will start with my application of the Rule. I hope you will join me in trying to take care of those around us a bit better in 2019. As always, please get in touch if I may assist with anything Council related. 
Save The Children



TRAINS The new January to May timetables should be delivered with this issue. Be especially careful when travelling, to check the times of trains before you set off, especially between Sunday 17 February and Friday 8 March. There will be engineering work in tunnels between Taunton and Tiverton Parkway. The long-distance Paddington to the SW services will be diverted, replacement coaches will take passengers between Taunton and Exeter St Davids, and **train times in Cornwall may be affected**. In the same period track renewals between Totnes and Plymouth mean there will be a reduced number of trains running on an amended timetable, with **possible effects on train times in Cornwall**.
