

Nature Among our birds there is a fascinating overlap between summer and winter visitors at this time of year. One day in mid October I saw a few Swallows flying over the village on their way to Africa. The following day I noticed a Black Redstart, a winter visitor to our coast. I now look forward to the possibility of a Blackcap or a tiny Firecrest in the garden or wintering thrushes in hedgerows. The Blackcaps that stay for winter are not the same birds that breed in our woodlands. The latter have moved south whereas the newcomers are a separate population that will have bred further east on the continent. A series of mild winters has enabled the Blackcaps to survive here instead of flying south and they have passed on the habit to later generations. They will stay until March when they begin to sing and become aggressive towards other birds at feeders. This takes me on to a sad situation that I noticed in September. Trichomonosis is a deadly disease that affects the digestive system of some birds and I saw the symptoms among Goldfinches. They become lethargic, cannot feed successfully and soon starve. A parasite is passed on by individuals around spilled and regurgitated food. If you feed your birds, please make sure that cages and tables are cleaned and that water in birdbaths is refreshed regularly. If possible you could rotate the feeders around your garden. Alan Payne

News from County - Jesse Foot

Winter Wellbeing: With the shorter and colder days of winter upon us, staying warm and healthy through the darker days can be a challenge for many. Cornwall Council run a number of Public Health Campaigns aimed at keeping one and all in good health. If you or anyone you know struggle to keep your home warm and dry, are on a low income, or have health problems, then the the Winter Well Being and Warm & Well Winter campaigns could help. Please contact the Winter Well Being team on 0800 954 1956 who can advise and connect you with 30 partner organisations or ring Bev from the Warm and Well Winter campaign on 01872 326552.

Drive Safely: The Safe38 group have been selling stickers and placing banners to raise awareness of their campaign for improved road safety along the A38. The group have had a number of key meetings with Highways England, Cornwall Council, and other stakeholders. Please support this group if you can on Facebook, by attending their meetings, buying a sticker, or campaigning with them. While the road needs to be made safer, dangerous driver behaviour causes many collisions. So, until the road sees



improvements, I'd like to remind and encourage both myself and other drivers with some tips to improve driver behaviour and make trips on any road a bit safer. **1) Leave Plenty of Stopping Distance** - many accidents are due to drivers following too closely, 'tailgating', not leaving enough space between themselves and the car in front - one local resident now leaves 6 seconds between the car in front - that's triple the recommended time - and remember to look ahead down the road to see what's coming. **2) Drive 5mph slower than the speed limit** - take your time, go a bit slower than the limit, enjoy the privilege of driving and remember that you shouldn't be exceeding the speed limit to pass someone. Living in the countryside means walkers, cyclists, animals, horseback riders, agricultural vehicles and others are using the roads as well so please slow down. **3) Stay Focussed** - Turn off your phone! or use a hands free device if absolutely necessary - That all important text, email, post, or phone call can and will wait until you are able to stop safely. **4) Keep Calm & Drive Safely** - A vehicle is one of the worst places to get angry and lose one's temper. We all make mistakes and errors in judgement - even the best drivers - so try to be gracious when others make mistakes. Keep Calm, Breathe deeply, Leave Space, Slow Down, Focus, and Drive Safely. One last reminder is that the **Tamar Valley AONB** are holding a consultation event about their future management plans on Saturday the 10th November at Eliot Hall, St Germans from 10am-2pm. Please come along to give your views on how best to shape the future actions and priorities of this Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. 
Remembrance Sunday 11 November 2018

Commemorating 100 years since the End of the First World War

The Great War brought so much suffering, so many young lives were lost and families left in tatters. They died for us and the freedom we enjoy today. We say thank you for their sacrifices. A short **Act of Remembrance** will be held outside the Royal British Legion War Memorial in **Tideford on Sunday 11 November commencing 10.45am**. A separate wreath will be laid for those from The Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry whose names are on the memorial and those who wish are invited to plant crosses in the Remembrance garden. **The Last Post** will be sounded and the **two minute silence** observed. The Standard will then be carried to **St Lukes's** church for a service of Remembrance conducted by the **Venerable Patrick Evans**. Church collection in aid of the Poppy Appeal. A wreath will also be laid on the commonwealth grave within the church yard. All are welcome, service and non service personnel, groups, children and any youth organisations to join at any stage. Meet up afterwards at the Royal British Legion for a complimentary buffet lunch. The bar will be open. We would like to see more people than ever attend this **special Remembrance Sunday**, please make an effort to come along and pay your respects to the proud young men who fought for us so bravely a century ago.

Stroke Befriending Service

I work for Volunteer Cornwall on the Stroke Befriending Service which launched this summer. It's a completely free service where we can match trained volunteers who have themselves had a stroke, with someone who has had a stroke and would like to speak to someone who understands. Our volunteers can visit people at home, in hospital or in a care home and we can also offer telephone, email and vide call befriending. We've found this service really helps to build confidence, reduce social isolation and make people feel more connected to their community. It's a new service and we need to get the word out so that people who have had a stroke and need some support can access the service, but also to help with recruiting volunteers who would like to help someone else in their recovery journey.

Community Bus News

Downderry and District Community Bus News
.....IMPORTANT INFORMATION.....



Elsa Guilfoyle will be standing down from her bus booking roll at the beginning of this month. You can phone her until 5pm on Friday 2nd November. Thereafter, from 9am on Monday 5th November, you must call our newest member of the bus team - Kath Banks on 01503 250611 to book a seat on the bus. You can of course chance it and just turn up but to ensure a seat, call Kath on 250611, Monday to Friday from 9am to 5 pm. Please do not call her outside these hours. We convey our thanks to Elsa for her dedication in this roll during the last eight years. Thank you Elsa. Also standing down from the bus "team" is Sue Langridge. Sue has run the 300 club for the last 9 years and has managed to raise an amazing £16,600 towards bus funds during that time. We are keen to find somebody to take over from Sue from November onwards. The role involves attending the coffee morning on the last Friday of each month for 3 hours plus an additional 2 hours per month paperwork. And, you get the chance to collect money from lots of lovely people ! We thank Sue for all her time spent persuading people to part with money during the last 9 years. Thank you Sue. £16,600 over 9 years "pro rata" equates to around £9,000 over 5 years. This money is used entirely towards the funding of a new bus every 5 years. The new bus which we hope to purchase in 12 months time will cost over £60,000 ! The remaining £51,000 comes from money raised by the Friends Of The Bus group - £11,500 over 5 years, the donations which you put into the donations box in the bus - £7,400 over 5 years and the fares you pay to use the bus, plus, the grants we receive from councils for our community using the bus. There are actually 7 different sources of our income and since 1985, we have raised sufficient funds to purchase a new bus every 5 years If any one of these income sources were to reduce, we would struggle to keep our bus on the road. It is of concern to the bus committee that we are seeing an overall reduction in passenger numbers, little by little, year by year. Unless we can halt this reduction, we will begin to struggle to maintain a viable community bus service at some time in the not too distant future. So, I make this appeal to everyone in NutTree land to support our community bus by using it ! If you are reading this, then I mean you ! We run trips to Plymouth, Liskeard and Trago every week. You can use your bus pass on these trips. We also run trips to Truro, Exeter, Tavistock, Totnes on a monthly basis. We are always willing to listen to our community for suggestions of other trips. As a

result of recent requests, we now have a regular trip to Looe on the first Monday of each month. Depart 11.30, return 3pm and all for £2.00 ! Call Kath Banks on 250611 to book a seat.

DOWNDERRY AND DISTRICT COMMUNITY BUS 300





Our aim is to make this site a relevant, go-to, factual source informing residents, and visitors, on what is happening, and what services are available, in our adjacent villages. Obviously the website can only be as good as the information it provides, and to satisfy that, we do need residents to share news on their organisation and their services. Do keep us in touch by emailing info@dasra.co.uk We are geared up to keep the site up-to-date, and we can handle updates, and changes, at any time. In September, the DASRA Committee held a meeting with many of those who have been subscribing to the **Donderry and Seaton Community Fund**. The Fund was set up in February 2016 when residents came together to discuss what to do on hearing of the imminent closure of our local Post Office Service. It was recognised that this could be just the first of a number of key facilities and services which could come under threat now or in the future. Those present agreed to the creation of a Community Fund which would be available, as and when action was needed, to maintain key services and to support initiatives that would enhance the lives of local residents. Since then, the Fund secured two years of subsidy to retain a Post Office Service until March this year when a 4-hour a week outreach service was agreed with Post Office Ltd. No further subsidy is required so current subscribers came together in early Sept to consider the future of the Community Fund. Following discussions on potential benefits, the audience agreed that the Community Fund should continue and hoped that more residents would be encouraged to support its growth into the future. It was also agreed that the Committee Members of DASRA be given responsibility to manage the Fund on behalf of the community. Family Surf Event at Seaton Beach




St Germans Thursday Club
